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Enaleen Draai holds the position of Professor in the Department of Public Management and Leadership, School of Governmental and Social Sciences in the Faculty of Humanities. Her career includes serving as the Director of the School: Governmental and Social Sciences from 1 April 2016 to 30 June 2019, where she was instrumental in curriculum development and nurturing the academic project. She continues to contribute her expertise to a number of faculty and institutional committees. Her academic journey began in 1997 as a lecturer at the PE Technikon, following a period of service in an administrative capacity from 1994 to 1997 as a faculty officer.

Enaleen holds a DPhil in Public Administration from the Nelson Mandela University. Her doctoral and postdoctoral studies were supported by the NRF with Thuthuka grants. She obtained her Master's in Public Administration from Stellenbosch University and BA (Hons) in Public Administration from Robert Gordon University, UK, funded by the British Undergraduate Fellowship scheme.

Her overarching research focus is Public organisational capacity building and policy management with niche areas that include service quality, organisational reputation management, organisational trust, skills development, policy capacity, and policy implementation. Her research focus in higher education is on institutional renewal and social justice with a lens on gender equity and equality within academia. She regularly publishes in her research niche areas and contributes to book chapters. She is the content editor of the book *A Practical Introduction to Public Management*.
